**Re: People of the State of New York v. Salvatore and Margueritte DiCarlo & Patrick Vecchio**

Dear Supervisor Vecchio:

This letter is not about 255 Kohr Road, Richard Vecchio, Gregory Hild, you or John Toomey, Esq. Rather, it concerns Nassau Suffolk Lumber located across from Town Hall which sold its property to **Salvatore DiCarlo of South Fork Management** who is a convicted felon. A *Westlaw* or *Loislaw* search would have revealed material facts **about him to wit: *People v. DiCarlo*, 293 A.D.2d 279 (1<sup>st</sup> Dep't), leave to appeal denied 98 N.Y.2d 767 (2002) where “the evidence at trial established that defendants intended to deprive the School Construction Authority of property... and wrongfully obtained such property in an amount exceeding... \$50,000.” “Defendants inflated the cost of renovating a building, thereby obtaining reimbursement in excess of their contractual entitlement.” Convicted of Grand Larceny in the Second Degree, Criminal Possession of a Forged Instrument in the Second Degree (6 counts) and Offering a False Instrument for Filing in the First Degree (48 counts), Sal and Marge were sentenced to 1 to 3 years in prison, conditional discharges and fines of \$5,000. The DiCarlos’ Eserac Realty was sentenced to a fine of \$10,000. Each was ordered to pay \$81,000 in restitution.**

**This is the DiCarlo who knocked down the Nassau Suffolk lumber yard buildings without a permit so he could save up to \$47,000 on his taxes. The same felon on whose behalf Tax Assessor Gregory Hild sought and received a sweetheart opinion baptizing DiCarlo’s profiting from his criminal conduct. The same South Fork felon who “has been in discussions with the Town of Smithtown about a plan to run a sewer line from the Nassau Suffolk Lumber Company property to the CH OWS site so that he can develop a three-story mixed use building...” (*Smithtown News-March 12, 2009 p. 3*) Come out of that woodpile. You thwarted a Notice of Appearance from developers in Smithtown’s Building and Planning Departments, let alone check their backgrounds. You feared a Notice-of-Appeal like a dirty boy fears a washbasin. Clean don’t mean green for you! A prior felony conviction probably serves as a favorable reference. Such proof of the pudding as has surfaced thus far is Frank Esposito and Robert Fitzpatrick’s \$10,000 to Chief Building Inspector Robert Bonerba -- Count Court on April 8<sup>th</sup>. April 4<sup>th</sup>’s *Newsday* reports that the Suffolk District Attorney has subpoenaed CHOWS records “by the same developer who recently partially took down buildings on a downtown lot that were later found to contain asbestos.” Is federal money slated for Maple Avenue?**

David Ambro’s *Smithtown News* and Phillip Sciarillo’s *Smithtown Messenger* are enablers of a 30-year continuing criminal enterprise, which is Smithtown Government. You are the *capo di tutti capii*. Its epicenters of criminality are its Building, Planning and Environmental Departments, its Zoning and Planning Boards.
